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Part III: Guidelines for Matching Donation Program

SMART's Matching Donation Program is open to U.S.-based employees and is intended to recognize and support the important work of non-profit organizations, which are tax-exempt under the U.S. Internal Revenue Code, Section 501(c)(3), and are organizations to which contributions by individuals and corporations are deductible on their federal income tax returns. Our Matching Donation Program is designed to encourage and match employees' charitable contributions to qualified organizations.

SMART will match any qualifying donation over \$25 and up to \$2,500 annually per employee to eligible organizations.

Eligible Organizations / Donations

The following organizations/donations are eligible to receive matching donations from SMART:

- Accredited educational institutions, including primary, secondary, technical, and specialized schools, colleges and junior colleges, universities, and graduate and professional schools
- Community and civic organizations, such as the Lions Club or Rotary Club
- Arts and cultural organizations
- Hospital and healthcare agencies
- Social service organizations or charitable organizations that are non-profit, for example, soup kitchens, the American Red Cross, the American Cancer Society, and the American Diabetes Association
- Environmental organizations
- The United Way

Ineligible Organizations / Donations

The following organizations/donations are not eligible to receive matching donations:

- Religious, political, or fraternal organizations
- Athletic booster clubs; athletic scholarships; or athletics funds, foundations or facilities
- Donations solely for religious payments, tuition payments, or membership fees to alumni associations
- Dues to clubs, such as the Lions Club or the Rotary Club
- Subscription fees for publications
- Payments to organizations or institutions in return for benefits or services
- Donations for the private benefit of specified individuals

Donation Criteria

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To qualify for a matching donation, the employee's donation must meet the following conditions:

- 1. The donation must be an actual donation, not just a pledge.
- 2. The donation must be made directly to the eligible organization.
- 3. SMART's Matching Donation Form must be used.

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SMART may modify, suspend, or terminate the Matching Donation Program at any time. The interpretation, application, and administration of the Matching Donation Program shall be determined by SMART's Community Involvement Committee, whose decision shall be final.

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
